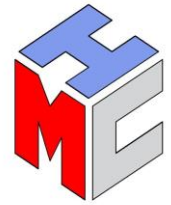

I found this picture whilst having a tidy out in our spare room, not quite sure what year this is but interesting to see how many of us are still attending the club.



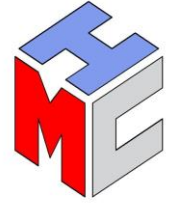

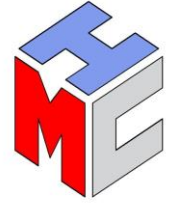
Essex Wildlife Trust show

A little bit of clarification.....

So, in light of the events of the above show, let me clarify a couple of points for members, regardless of modelling skill, or time, or lack of it, spent as a member of I.P.M.S. Hornchurch.

- If you're a member, you have the right to display your model / models on the club stand.
- Members should allow an equal amount of space for each other on the club stand. I don't expect to see people with tape measures working out the area, just common sense.
- If somebody has a large number of models on the table, I would expect them to remove a couple to make room for all the members models. After all, you can swap your models around half way through the day.
- However, the only proviso to this is that the club table must be complete for the shows advertised opening time, as there are people coming in, paying to see a model show, not bare tables, but it would be gentlemanly to still swap out a few models for a latecomer as we've all been caught in traffic at one time or another.

Please don't think that this is in any way a rebuke aimed any club member, past or present, or me just being heavy handed. After my opening comments at the top of this article I simply don't want anybody to feel that for whatever reason that they are not in any way a "full and proper" member of this club.
